As a follow on to Harrisburg event several months ago, we did a combined presentation on flood insurance/flood plain management/legal aspects last week in Salt Lake City and it went well. State of Montana is talking about bringing us back out in July; RNN to think about possibly doing the RNN Annual Meeting here as well. Discussing ways to make the Curriculum entirely user friendly for post-disasterwork.
